<u>THE 12 TRIBES</u> OF ISRAEL

Naphtali

This month we will talk about Naphtali, the 6th son of Jacob. But first let's review of the sons we have already covered;

Rueben: was well-meaning but easily swayed. Not a firm decision-maker.

Simeon: was mean, violent and opinionated.

Levi: tended toward violence like his brother Simeon, but as a tribe, they took a firm stand for God's honor and God blessed his descendants for that.

Judah: was a prosperous and intelligent leader.

Dan: was intelligent but he was a criticizer of others. He was also a gossiper, a traitor, and a backbiter.

The 12 precious stone foundations of the New Jerusalem are inscribed with the names of the 12 disciples. Rev. 12:14

The stones are similar in both breastplate the High Priest wore and in the foundations of the New Jerusalem. This forms the links between the tribes and the apostles.

Reuben was paired with Thaddaeus, Simeon was paired with Simon the Zealot, Judah with Thomas, Dan the son of Jacob and Judas the disciple are out.

Levi was paired with Matthias. Levi took the place of Dan and Matthias took the place of Judas.

Naphtali was Jacob's sixth son, the second child of Bilhah, Rachel's servant. The child's name means "my wrestling" or "my struggle" which reflects Rachel's rivalry with Leah for bearing children to Jacob. At his birth the frustrated Rachel ex-

claimed "With mighty wrestling's I have wrestled with my sister and, and have prevailed." (Gen 30:1-8).

Naphtali was a quiet and studious man. He represents the earnest worker who accomplishes a great deal while staying in the background. Jewish records suggest that Naphtali was a speedy runner, and that he had a quick mind and pleasant manner with an easy way of speaking. For these reasons he was chosen by Joseph as one of the five brothers who should represent the family when the prime minister should introduce his clan to Pharaoh. The grace of his speech and the charm of his personality would have qualified him to take on court responsibilities with ease. In fact, generations later we find among Solomon's court officials Ahimaaz, of the tribe of Naphtali, specifically noted for having married Basmath, one of the king's daughters. 1kings 4:15.

In his dying prophecy Jacob

declared: "Naphtali is a hind let loose; he giveth goodly words" Gen 49:21. In using this metaphor he depicted his son as alert, quick to sense danger, swift in flight, and easy and graceful in motion. Some scholars think that Naphtali's wandering tendencies were being alluded to in the phrase of Jacob's blessing, "a deer, let loose" (Gen 49:21).

He was intelligent, affectionate, tender, lovable and gentle, and possibly a handsome man. Ancient Jewish legends have it that he died in Egypt at the age of 132 years.

The Naphtalities played an important part in the two conflicts led by Deborah and Gideon (Judg 4:6, 10; 5:18; 6:35; 7:23). Barak, the son of Abinoam, who commanded the armies under Deborah's direction, was from Naphtali (Judg 4:6). The song of Deborah praises Zebulun and Naphtali for their bravery in defeating

Sisera and the Canaanites (Judg 5:18). When David became ruler over all of Israel after Saul's death, the tribe of Naphtali joined the new king at Hebron with a large army. They also brought food and provisions for the armies (I Chr 12:34, 39-40).

In the Blessing of Moses, Naphtali is mentioned as being "full of the blessing of the Lord". Deut 33:23. They were to possess land to "the west and the south" (Deut 33:23). This phrase de-

scribes the territory adjacent to the western shore of Galilee and extending northward (Josh 19:32-39). Joshua 19:35 shows that there were many fortified cities in Naphtali. Naphtali was one of the few tribes who actually took possession of their assigned territory fully.

The location in Canaan was not without danger. Even though it had fortifications, since it lay far to the north, it was easy prey for the invading Syrians during Baasha's reign.

Isaiah alludes to the sufferings of Naphtali in his prophecies, and promises that they will once again see light among the sealed remnant. and receive comfort (Is 9:1-7). An interpretation of this prophecy is later given in the NT, when Jesus initiates his ministry in the region of Galilee and calls his first disciples from its shores (Matt 4:13-22).

Inspiration reveals that the Light of the world would first shine in Naphtali. Matt. 4:13 -16. In Galilee Jesus performed more miracles and spoke more gracious words

and helped more needy persons than anywhere else. People like Naphtali will be Rev. 7:6 and march into the City of God through the pearly gate inscribed with his name. Naphtali developed a character which Providence decided was safe to save. Nathaniel, also called Bartholomew, is his counterpart in the foundation of the city. He left no book, wrote no epistle, preached no sermon, yet God's kingdom has a place for all like him.

The 5 Second Rule, the "research" continues

Have you ever heard anyone invoke the "5 second rule" after dropping a piece of food on the floor? The idea behind this rule is that food that is picked up in fewer than 5 seconds after hitting the floor has not had time to attract germs, and is safe to eat. The rule goes on to imply that food remaining on the floor longer than 5 seconds is likely to have become contaminated and should not be eaten.

While this rule has been tested on the Discovery Channel's MythBusters in a quasi-scientific manner (and by the way, did not pass muster), it has also been evaluated in at least three, more rigorous, scientific studies. The first report evaluating the "5 second rule" was published by a researcher at the University of Illinois in 2003. This study involved dropping gummy bears and fudge-striped cookies onto floor tiles that were contaminated with E. coli bacteria (a preliminary survey performed by this researcher had indicated that people were more likely to pick up candy than, say, broccoli). In every instance, the food items became contaminated in 5 seconds or less, dispelling the notion that it is safe to eat food that has been on the floor for any length of time.

Claiming that this study was not representative of what actually happens in the "real world", two student-researchers at Connecticut College designed a study to test the rule in an everyday environment. They dropped food samples (apple slices and Skittles) onto the floors of the college dining hall and snack bar. The food samples were allowed to remain on the unaltered floor for various lengths of time from 5 seconds to 5 minutes. Interestingly, no bacteria were present on the foods that had remained on the floor for 5, 10 or 30 seconds, lending support to the "5 second rule." The apple slices did pick up bacteria after one minute, however, and the Skittles became contaminated with bacteria after remaining on the floor for 5 minutes.

The most recent study on the subject, performed at the Aston University's School of Life and Health Sciences in England, found similar results as the "Skittles" study. While the initial contact of various foods with the floor was found to transfer a small amount of bacteria, the longer that food remained on the floor the greater the contamination. Moist foods left on the floor for longer than 30 seconds picked up 10 times more bacteria than when picked up prior to the 5 second "deadline". Interestingly, carpeted floors were less likely to transfer bacteria to a dropped piece of food.

My take on this rule: if food lands on a contaminated surface it can pick up disease-producing bacteria almost immediately. If it lands on a clean surface, it could conceivably remain safe to eat for hours. The problem is that without biologic testing of the surface, it is impossible to know if the surface is clean or contaminated. It is probably true; however, that the shorter the period of time that food remains on the floor the less likely it is to attract bacteria. The next time you see someone drop some food on the floor, rather than calling out "5 second rule" it is probably best to say, "When in doubt, toss it out".

COCONUT OIL UNFAIRLY ATTACKED

In June 2017, the American Heart Association (AHA) blasted coconut oil in a public relations piece, posing as "science," as part of a larger attach on "saturated fats." Carotec co-founder Tom Valentine extolled the benefits of coconut oil in the 1990's in radio interviews with Dr. Mary Enig who explained how coconut oil was maligned. Carotec has used coconut oil in formulas long before it became popular.

The AHA admitted there are no studies directly indicting coconut oil: "Clinical trials that compared direct effects on CVD (Cardiovascular Disease) of coconut oil and other dietary oils have not been reported."

So, why the fuss? The AHA cherry-picked four studies to make the wrong-headed conclusion that saturated fats increase cholesterol levels, which in turn, increases cardiovascular disease. The selected studies are problematic.

For instance, the study which provided the largest number of participants (skewing results) was not a randomized control trial; and it involved hospital patients who were being treated with antipsychotic medications which were later found to increase heart disease.

Studies which were favorable to the idea that saturated fats are not implicated in heart disease or may be beneficial for heart health and cancer prevention were excluded.

Many factors impair cardiovascular health, such as hydrogenated fats, fluoridated water and many prescription drugs, particularly by causing inflammation.

The hydrogenation issue is the elephant in the room so to speak and as Dr. Enig wrote in 2009, many of the studies used to blame coconut oil for possible cardiovascular ill-health were done with hydrogenated coconut oil.

Dr. Enig wrote on Westonprice.org that "saturated fats do not clog arteries, whether they are the short- and medium-chain type in coconut oil or the longer chain fatty acids in beef, cream and cheese."

Even *The New York Times* on March 1, 2011 confirmed what Dr. Enig wrote by quoting Thomas Brenna, professor of science at Cornell University, who told the *Times*, "Most of the studies involving coconut oil were done with partially hydrogenated coconut oil, which researchers used because they needed to raise the cholesterol levels of their rabbits in order to collect certain data." Dr. Brenna said, "Virgin coconut oil, which has not been chemically treated, is a different thing in terms of a health risk perspective. And maybe it isn't so bad for you after all."

Yes, you read that correctly: even *The New York Times* wrote that hydrogenated oils were used to raise cholesterol levels. The tepid "isn't so bad for you after all" doesn't go nearly far enough, though, because coconut oil's benefits include its powerful antibacterial and anti-microbial properties, as well as the fact it is used by the body for a solid source of "energy" rather than storage.

Dr. Enig wrote that flawed coconut oil studies didn't only involve the cholesterol/heart disease fallacy but also, in the area of cognitive function. Dr. Enig wrote "it is important to explain why so many animal studies get negative results for coconut oil. The coconut oil used in laboratory studies is usually fully hydrogenated coconut oil. The process of full hydrogenation gets rid of all the unsaturated fatty acids in coconut oil. Researchers began using fully hydrogenated coconut oil to study the effects of essential fatty acid deficiency—they used coconut oil because it is the only fat that can be fully hydrogenated and still be soft enough for rats to eat. The poor results obtained in these studies—such as mental impairment—are due to essential fatty acid (EFA) deficiency and not the fault of the saturated fats in coconut oil. It is extremely deceitful for commentators to blame coconut oil in studies such as these—as they often do."

Coconuts and coconut oil have been used for thousands of years in native diets without any indication that coconut oil contributed to heart (or other diseases); in fact, population studies showed less cardiovascular insult in those who consumed coconut and other tropical oils. In the 20th century, polyunsaturated vegetable oils became an industry favorite and science was "bought" to attack saturated fats to favor certain vegetable oil interests.

AHA scientists are not stupid people but rather part of an organized movement to keep people misinformed enough not to deeply question our food supply and pharmaceutical interventions.

There's pushback, though. Truth will win.

Prophesy Highlights

The Three Angels and the Other Angel (Part One)

"There are those now living who, in studying the prophecies of Daniel and John, received great light from God as they passed over the ground where special prophecies were in process of fulfillment in

their order. They bore the message of time to the people. The truth shone out clearly as the sun at noonday. Historical events, showing the direct fulfillment of prophecy, were set before the people, and the prophecy was seen to be figurative delineation of events leading down to the close of this earth's history. The scenes connected with the working of the man of sin are the last features plainly revealed in this earth's history. The people now have a special message to give to the world, the third angel's message. Those who, in their experience, have passed over the ground, and acted a part in the proclamation of the first (Revelation 14:6 & 7), second (Revelation 14:8), third (Revelation 14:9-11) angels' messages, are not so liable to be led into false paths as are those who have not had an experimental knowledge of the people of God." (Manuscript 31, 1896)

"The proclamation of the first, second, and third angels' messages has been located by the Word of Inspiration. Not a peg or a pin is to be removed. No human authority has any more right to change the location of these messages than to substitute the New Testament for the Old. The Old Testament is the gospel in figures and symbols. The New Testament is the substance. One is as essential as the other. The Old Testament presents lessons from the lips of Christ, and these lessons have not lost their force in any particular."

"The first and second messages were given in 1843 and 1844, and we are now under the proclamation of the third; but all three of the messages are still to be proclaimed. It is just as essential now as ever before that they shall be repeated to those who are seeking for the truth. By pen and voice we are to sound the proclamation, showing their order, and the application of the prophecies that bring us to the third angel's message. There cannot be a third without the first and the second. These messages we are to give to the world in publications, in discourses, showing in the line of prophetic history the things that have been and the things that will be."

"The history of the church and the world, *the loyal and the disloyal*, is here plainly revealed. The loyal under the proclamation of the third angel's message have turned their feet into the way of God's commandments, to respect, to honor, and to glorify Him who created the heavens and the earth. The opposing force has dishonored God by making a breach in His law, and when light from His Word has called attention to His holy commandments, revealing the breach made in the law by another authority, then, to get rid of conviction, men have tried to destroy the whole law. But could it be destroyed? No; for all who will search the scriptures for themselves will see that the law of God stands immutable, eternal, and His memorial (the Sabbath Commandment) will endure through the eternal ages, pointing to the only true God in distinction from all false gods (Isaiah 58:12-14). Los acontecimientos históricos, mostrando el cumplimiento directo de la profecía, fueron puestos ante el pueblo, y la profecía fue vista como una delimitación figurativa de los acontecimientos que conducen al final de la historia de esta tierra. Las escenas rela-

cionadas con el trabajo del hombre de pecado son las últimas características claramente reveladas en la historia de esta tierra. La gente ahora tiene un mensaje especial para dar al mundo, el mensaje del tercer ángel. Aquellos que en su experiencia han pasado por el suelo y han participado en la proclamación de los ángeles primero (Apocalipsis 14: 6 y 7), segundo (Apocalipsis 14: 8), tercero (Apocalipsis 14: 9-11) "no son tan susceptibles de ser conducidos a falsos caminos como los que no han tenido un conocimiento experimental del pueblo de Dios" (Manuscrito 31, 1896).

"La proclamación del primer, segundo y tercer mensaje de los ángeles ha sido localizada por la Palabra de Inspiración. No se debe retirar una clavija o un pasador. Ninguna autoridad humana tiene más derecho a cambiar la ubicación de estos mensajes que a sustituir el Nuevo Testamento por el Antiguo. El Antiguo Testamento es el evangelio en figuras y símbolos. El Nuevo Testamento es la sustancia. Uno es tan esencial como el otro. El Antiguo Testamento presenta lecciones de los labios de Cristo, y estas lecciones no han perdido su fuerza en ningún particular ".

"Los primeros y segundos mensajes fueron dados en 1843 y 1844, y ahora estamos bajo la proclamación de la tercera; pero los tres mensajes aún no han sido proclamados. Es tan esencial ahora como siempre que se repitan a los que buscan la verdad. Por la pluma y la voz debemos sonar la proclamación, mostrando su orden, y la aplicación de las profecías que nos traen al mensaje del tercer ángel. No puede haber un tercero sin el primero y el segundo. Estos mensajes debemos dar al mundo en publicaciones, en discursos, mostrando en la línea de la historia profética las cosas que han sido y las que serán ".

"La historia de la iglesia y del mundo, la leal y la desleal, está aquí claramente revelada. Los leales bajo la proclamación del mensaje del tercer ángel han puesto sus pies en el camino de los mandamientos de Dios, para respetar, honrar y glorificar a Aquel que creó los cielos y la tierra. La fuerza opuesta ha deshonrado a Dios haciendo una brecha en Su ley, y cuando la luz de Su Palabra ha llamado la atención a Sus santos mandamientos, revelando la violación hecha en la ley por otra autoridad, entonces, para deshacerse de la convicción, los hombres han intentado para destruir toda la ley. ¿Pero podría ser destruido? No; porque todos los que buscan las Escrituras por sí mismos verán que la ley de Dios permanece inmutable, eterna, y Su memoria (el mandamiento del Sábado) durará a través de los siglos eternos, señalando al único Dios verdadero distinto de todos los dioses falsos 58: 12-14). (Manuscrito 32, 1896)
