### SPOTLIGHT THIS MONTH "ERIC ANDERSON"

## CHURCH BASEMENT PROJECT

The Almond SDA church is in the midst of a renovation project in our basement. Over the last 80 or so years, the cinder block walls on the north and northwest sides of the foundation have begun to push in. The hill that is against these walls has put a lot of strain on them and over time the mortar between the blocks has crumbled into powder so the blocks have been pushing out. We have undertaken the task of strengthening the walls so that no further buckling can

occur.

We began by chipping out the face of every other block, (as in a checkerboard fashion) which opens up the cores inside. Then we poured cement down into the core and inserted lengths of rebar to further provide strength. We then finished up by mortaring the entire inside surface of the wall to provide a complete sheet of exterior strength.

Upon completion of all this cement work, we will frame in a new wall structure, butted

up against the cement wall and finish it off with drywall and paint

The plan is to complete this project by November of 2015 at a total cost of approximately \$500 for materials. Labor is being provided by several of our members who have been under the guidance and expertise of Brian Waters.

Bill Boehm is heading up a project to replace the front doors of our church and give us a well needed face lift to the community.

This project will cost about \$1500 and should be completed prior to cold weather. Praise God for these workers of the ministry.

**WHAT'S HAPPENING WITH WRAO RADIO?**

**91.7 FM WRAO**

The Seventh-day Adventist Christian radio station in Wisconsin Rapids is marching onward. For the last year it has been broadcasting low-power from the side of the church building. Basically, its reach is the same as the city limits, but praise the Lord, many people have told me they can still hear it outside of the city. Letters from the community have come in, giving positive feedback to the station.

However, a low-power broadcast was not a part of the original vision for this station.

Seven plus years ago, the 91.7 frequency was acquired for high-power; circumstances have not allowed a full-power station to be put up until now. Recently land has been cleared and equipment purchased to make this station, 91.7 WRAO, a full power station! Problems have come along throughout the WRAO's journey, but with every problem, the Lord has brought a solution. It is the Lord's work to bring the good news to everybody, even to our neighbors. This tool, radio, is such a great way to plant the seed of truth, which will lead

people to Jesus. It has been the endeavor of the radio committee and the Wisconsin Rapids Church to get this project up and going as soon as possible, because time is short.
