## SURVIVAL FOOD

In case you ever find yourself forced to forage for wild foods and/or herbal medicines, here's some useful information that will help. Knowledge of these plants could very well save your life. There are five questions you need to know about edible, non-toxic plants: What is it good for? Where do I find it? How do I identify it? How do I prepare it? And can I cultivate it in my garden?

Various edible, non-toxic plants can provide: essential forms of energy that serve as fuel for the body; essential vitamins and minerals that prevent certain debilitating conditions such as Beriberi and Scurvy; or serve to replace essential health remedies that we normally keep in our medicine cabinets such as aspirin, antacid, and cough suppressant. There are wild food sources; natural sources of vitamins and minerals; and plants that serve as natural forms of medicine. Wild food sources would include: leafy vegetables, roots, tubers, bulbs, fruits, berries, nuts, and seeds. Each of these provides essential vitamins, minerals, fats, proteins, and/or carbohydrates. Natural sources of vitamins and minerals are what we must have in sufficient quantities to function properly. Natural Health Remedies include common plants that alleviate common ailments such as coughs and upset stomachs as well as replacing antiseptic and antibiotic ointments.

1. Curly Dock (Rumex spp.) (Leafy vegetable)



What is it good for? High in vitamins and minerals: Vit. A, E, C, K, iron, magnesium, manganese, calcium, folic acid carotenoids, and Omega 3 fatty acids; high in fiber; keeps digestive system working properly; contains antioxidants which helps prevent cell damage.

Where do I find it? Abundant throughout North America—moist, cultivated or disturbed soils, pastures, fallow fields, field edges, and fence rows.

<u>How do I identify it?</u> Height is 1 to 5 ft; long, slim, lance-shaped, green leaves up to 20 inches in length with distinctly wavy edges. There are several species of the Dock plant, but all are edible. Their taste ranges from highly palatable to extremely bitter with a slightly lemony taste.

<u>How do I prepare it?</u> The leaves are most often eaten in a salad similar to lettuce, or steamed or stewed, and eaten like spinach or mustard.

<u>Will it grow in my garden?</u> Yes, the Dock plant can be cultivated in gardens and flowerbeds throughout the lower 48 states. Dock prefers open sunny areas, moist, cultivated, and well-drained soil. (Submitted by Dorothy Tess)

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#### **Personal Testimony**

#### Never Give Up on Your Loved Ones

My mother was a Seventh-day Adventist and my dad a Lutheran and they remained so through their 69 years of marriage. They had four children who were all baptized in the Lutheran church as infants and in the Adventist church as early teens. Two of my three brothers remain Adventist today. I left the church at the age of 21 and followed my own way for 38 years. One of my brothers became an Adventist minister; I know that not only my mother but my two brothers in the church continued to pray for me fervently all of those 38 years. My mother died in 1999 before I came back to the church.

A few years after my parents' deaths, my brother, the pastor, was tested for extremely high blood pressure, which registered at 200/100, his creatinine level was +10 and his kidney function was at 24%. He and his wife spent 17 days at the Wildwood, GA, Lifestyle Center, but in January, 2004, he

was scheduled to go on dialysis. After some soul-searching on my part and nearly a year of dialysis on his, I decided I would donate a kidney to him, if we were a match. After a few tests, we found out we were compatible and we started the process needed to undertake a transplant. In October, 2004, I was honored to be able to donate my kidney to my brother.

In 2005, this same brother called me to ask how far Elgin, Illinois was from St. Charles, where we lived. I responded that it was about 20 minutes away, knowing what was coming next. Whenever he asked how far we were from a certain town, it was because there was going to be an evangelistic series there and he wanted us to attend. Up to this time, we never had. When I told him it was 20 minutes, he said "Good! Because there's a series starting there and I've registered you and Barry". I don't recommend this as a way to live your life, but I always believed in the teachings of the Adventist church and knew that someday I would return to it. So I was very willing to attend the meetings.

The rest is history; after taking Bible studies (twice), we joined the Elgin SDA church on September 30, 2005. My brother and sister-in-law traveled from Delaware so he could baptize us. During the ceremony, he stated "She gave me the gift of life; God gave her eternal life." I know this was a direct result of my mother's urgent prayers for me her whole life but especially after I left the church, and the prayers of my brothers. Talk about God's timing!!! For some reason, He thought that 38 years was just right but I am so thankful it happened His way. We became members of a very loving church who guided us all the way.


So, prayers for your family and loved ones do work, no matter how long it takes. We should never give up on them!! Please join with me as I continue to pray for my youngest brother so that all four of my mom's children will be raised with her when Jesus comes again!! I can't wait to see her face!!

his great desire was to be baptized and have true knowledge of Scripture.

Congratulations and God Bless You, Eleazar!



- <sup>17</sup> If the whole body were an eye, where were the hearing? If the whole were hearing, where were the smelling?
- <sup>28</sup> And God hath set some in the church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers, after that miracles, then gifts of healings, helps, governments, diversities of tongues.
- <sup>29</sup> Are all apostles? are all prophets? are all teachers? are all workers of miracles?
- <sup>30</sup> Have all the gifts of healing? do all speak with tongues? do all interpret?

Many different parts but one body and each part is vitally important for the proper function and vitality of the body. Each member is important for service. Some of us may not be able to preach or teach or physically help with the preparations but we can all pray, we can all encourage others and be inviting and supportive in some way. 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#### The Latter Rain

We are living in the very tip-toes of Daniel's prophetic statue. Jesus is poised to return once more and make all things right in His Name.

#### The Almond Tree

"Moreover the word of the Lord came unto me, saying Jeremiah, what do you see? And I said, I see a branch of an almond tree" Jeremiah 1:11

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#### MONTHLY HEALTH NUGGET

#### **Keeping Your Heart Healthy**

I promised last month to share some pointers on ways to keep your heart healthy. Here they are.

#### The Basics

Take steps today to lower your risk of heart disease and heart attack. Heart disease is the leading cause of death for both men and women in the United States.

To help prevent heart disease, you can:

Eat healthy and get active.

Watch your weight.

Quit smoking and stay away from secondhand smoke.

Control your cholesterol and blood pressure.

If you drink alcohol, drink only in moderation.

Take steps to prevent type 2 diabetes.

Manage stress.

#### Am I at risk for heart disease?

You are at higher risk for heart disease if:

You are a woman over age 55

You are a man over age 45

Your father or brother had heart disease before age 55

Your mother or sister had heart disease before age 65

As you get older, your risk for heart disease and heart attack increases. But the good news is that heart disease can be prevented.

#### What is heart disease?

When people talk about heart disease, they are usually talking about coronary heart disease (CHD). It's also called coronary artery disease (CAD). This is the most common type of heart disease. When someone has CHD, the coronary arteries (tubes) that take blood to the heart are narrow or blocked. This happens when cholesterol and fatty material, called plaque ("plak"), build up inside the arteries.

Plaque is caused by:

Fat and cholesterol in the blood

High blood pressure

**Smoking** 

Too much sugar in the blood (usually because of diabetes)

When plaque blocks an artery, it's hard for blood to flow to the heart. A blocked artery can cause chest pain or a heart attack.

#### What is a heart attack?

A heart attack happens when blood flow to the heart is suddenly blocked. Part of the heart may die if the person doesn't get help quickly.

Common signs of a heart attack include:

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Chest pain (or feeling pressure, squeezing, or fullness in your chest)

Pain or discomfort in the upper body – like the arms, back, neck, jaw, or upper stomach (above the belly button)

Trouble breathing (while resting or being active)

Feeling sick to your stomach or throwing up

Feeling dizzy, light-headed, or unusually tired

Breaking out in a cold sweat

Not everyone who has a heart attack will have all the signs.

#### Don't ignore changes in how you feel.

Signs of a heart attack often come on suddenly. But sometimes, they develop slowly – hours, days, or even weeks before a heart attack happens.

Talk to your doctor if you feel tired for several days, or if other health problems (like pain or trouble breathing) bother you more than usual.

#### Call 911 right away if you or someone else has signs of a heart attack.

Don't ignore any signs or feel embarrassed to call for help. Acting fast can save a life. Call 911 even if you are not sure it's a heart attack.

An ambulance is the best and safest way to get to the hospital. In an ambulance, EMTs (emergency medical technicians) can keep track of how you are doing and start life-saving treatments right away. People who call an ambulance often get treated faster at the hospital. And, if you call 911, the operator can tell you what to do until the ambulance gets there.

#### Take Action!

Take steps today to lower your risk for heart disease.

High blood pressure and high cholesterol can cause heart disease and heart attack.

#### Get your cholesterol checked.

Men need to get their cholesterol checked at least once every 5 years. Women at risk for heart disease need to get their cholesterol checked once every 5 years.

#### Get your blood pressure checked.

Starting at age 18, get your blood pressure checked at least once every 2 years. High blood pressure has no signs or symptoms.

#### Eat healthy.

<u>Eating healthy</u> can help lower your risk of heart disease. A heart-healthy diet includes foods that are low in saturated and *trans* fats, added sugars, and sodium (salt).

Heart-healthy items include high-fiber foods (whole grains, fruits, and vegetables) and certain fats (like the fats in olive oil and fish).

#### Get active.

<u>Getting active</u> can help prevent heart disease. Adults need at least 2 hours and 30 minutes of moderate aerobic activity each week. This includes walking fast, dancing, and biking.

If you are just getting started, try walking for 10 minutes a day, a few days each week. Then add more activity over time.

#### Watch your weight.

Extra weight can lead to high cholesterol, high blood pressure, and diabetes. If you are overweight or obese, losing just 10 pounds can lower your risk of heart disease.

#### Quit smoking.

Quitting smoking helps lower your risk of having a heart attack Manage stress.

<u>Managing stress</u> can help prevent serious health problems like heart disease, depression, and high blood pressure. Deep breathing and meditation are good ways to relax and manage stress.

#### Take steps to prevent type 2 diabetes.

When you have diabetes, there is too much glucose (sugar) in your blood. Over time, if it's not controlled, diabetes can cause serious health problems, including heart disease.

Eating healthy and getting active - can help keep your heart healthy.
