"Molehills in the Church"

As a teenager, I loved reading books, and one of my favorite genres was non-fiction action/adventure. They told of what was possible, of what was out there in this huge, incredible world that God has created for us. One such book, *Within Reach: My Everest Story*, was the riveting, true story of another teenager who at such a young age regularly climbed the highest mountains in the world. The book showed how you cannot expect to climb Everest in a day. No, to climb the elite 8000+ meter peaks, you need to spend years of grueling training, climbing smaller mountains, finding sponsors, cautiously planning every step, hiring large support teams, and feeding an all-consuming obsession with the quest. Climbing mountains tests the limits of human endurance.

Stepping over molehills does not. You barely have to raise your foot a little higher than normal to step over those pesky mounds. There is no need to take molehill climbing lessons; no Sherpas need to be hired to carry over your extra supplies. Yes, molehills are troublesome, no doubt about it – they can ruin gardens and sprain your ankle – but they are not mountains.

Sometimes in church we make mountains out of molehills. We spend our best energies on attacking each other over minor details, and yet talk little on what the Bible speaks a great deal.

Jesus warned the religious leaders in His day: "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you pay tithe of mint and anise and cumin, and have neglected the weightier matters of the law: justice and mercy and faith. These you ought to have done, without leaving the others undone." (Matthew 23:23 KJV)

The scribes and Pharisees in Jesus' day are a cautionary tale. They were focused on policing the consciences and actions of other believers instead of encouraging them in growth in their personal relationships with God. Because of their prejudices, the scribes and Pharisees saw enemies in people Jesus came to save. How about you? Do you neglect the weightier matters of the law? What are the molehills in your church?

Try and get them to me as soon as possible so that Pastor has time to research the answer for us. Someone gave me a question to start out with and here it comes. Thank you Pastor Justin for doing this for us and may God bless you in your efforts.

Question: Why were so many of the miracles that Elijah performed repeated by Elisha?

Examples:

- 1. **Elijah** asked a widow for food, and the small amount of oil and flour didn't run out: 1 Kings 17:9; **Elisha** tells a widow to fill all the jars she can find with a small amount of oil and it didn't run out: 2 Kings 4:7.
- 2. **Elijah** stretched out on the boy and brings the widow's son back to life: 1 Kings 17:20; **Elisha** stretched out on the boy and brings the Shunammite's son back to life: 2 Kings 4:34.
- 3. **Elijah** divided the waters of the Jordan to cross: 2 Kings 2:8; **Elisha** divided the waters of the Jordan to cross: 2 Kings 2:14.

Answer:

An insightful question! The Bible gives no explicit reason for their miracles being so similar so we cannot know for sure, but perhaps the reason is a request Elisha had made. When Elijah was preparing to leave this life, Elijah asked Elisha how he could help his assistant one last time. Elisha responded that he wanted "a double portion of your spirit upon me." (2 Kings 2:9). God granted Elisha's request, and perhaps these similarities are examples of how Elisha followed in Elijah's example, but with even greater – 2x greater – the outpouring of the supernatural influence of the Holy Spirit.

By the way, we can learn from Elijah and Elisha's relationship. We should accept the counsel and guidance of spiritual mentors, just as Elisha learned from Elijah, and later Elisha had personal assistants and ran schools of the prophets. Being a disciple for Jesus is more than just developing your spiritual gifts, it is passing those gifts on to others.



ADVENTISM'S VISITATION (PART SEVEN)

"The prophecies which the great I AM has given in His word, uniting link after link in the chain of events, from eternity in the past to eternity in the future, tell us where we are today in the procession of the ages and what may be expected in the time to come." THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE CHAIN OF TRUTH: "God sent His angel to move upon the heart of a farmer who had not believed the Bible, to lead him to search the prophecies. Angels of God repeatedly visited that chosen one, to guide his mind and open to his understanding prophecies which had ever been dark to God's people. The commencement of the chain of truth was given to him, and he was led on to search for link after link, until he looked with wonder and admiration upon the Word of God. He saw there a perfect chain of truth. That Word which he had regarded as uninspired now opened before his vision in its beauty and glory. He saw that one portion of Scripture explains another, and when one passage was closed to his understanding, he found in another part of the Word that which explained it. He regarded the sacred Word of God with joy and with the deepest respect and awe." Early Writings, 229–232.

THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE CHAIN OF TRUTH (The 'Palmoni' or Prophetic Numbering): 677BC, 457BC & 508BC "From a farther study of the Scriptures, I concluded that the seven times of Gentile supremacy must commence when the Jews ceased to be an independent nation at the captivity of Manasseh, which the best chronologies assigned to B. C. 677; that the 2300 days commenced with the seventy weeks, which the best chronologies dated from B. C. 457; and that the 1335 days commencing with the taking away of the daily, and the setting up of the abomination that makes desolate, [Daniel 12:11] were to be dated from the setting up of the Papal supremacy, after the taking away of Pagan abominations, and which, according to the best historians I could consult, should be dated from about A. HOW THE "NEW" ALMOND CHURCH ORGAN CAME TO BE

A few years ago, I was invited to play the Rodgers church organ for the Stevens Point Baptist Church—which I happily did. I enjoyed it very much, and the congregation (6-10 people) seemed to enjoy it as well. But during the last year I played for them, the congregation dwindled down to about 6 old ladies. I could see that this church was about to die out.

There was one younger lady—about 60 or 70 plus--who was the spice of the group and led out very enthusiastically. Since I felt my name was written all over that organ—that I would some day have it to play, I said to her, "If you ever want to sell this organ, give me a call." She said, "OK."

Time went on, and I didn't hold my breath, but I wondered how things would track out concerning the organ. Then, our older church organ—which was close to 50 years old—began to show signs of deterioration. When the organ repairman came out to tune it, he revealed that the capacity to be tuned was at its limit. It had old technology which involved screwing components to change the tune; certain stops had ceased to respond; and some of the keys were a bit inappropriately vibratory. It was a real perplexity for this organist. It was like pretending to play an organ that wasn't all there. I began to mention to our church members that we really ought to consider getting a better organ. I wasn't even thinking about the Stevens Point organ at that time, because I hadn't heard from the Baptist Church in a while. I just knew we would benefit with a better organ.

During the time I was suggesting a better organ (which I think took a few weeks), to my great surprise, the Baptist lady called me and said they were ready to sell their organ! Karen Ferguson and I went to see the organ. Karen checked it out extensively and was satisfied it was in good condition and would be a nice acquisition for our church.

I had done some research as to how much an organ of this quality should cost. The price suggested was \$5,000 without speakers, and \$7,000 with speakers. I asked the Baptist lady if she would accept \$5,000. She said she would have to ask the committee. The answer came back, "Yes."

I felt I could ask her if she would take \$5,000 (without church vote), because I knew the organ was either going to end up in my home or the church, and I wanted to speak up for it before some other group or company could snap it up. I asked the church members to help cover the cost so that it would be a "community thing" instead of one single payer.

After much discussion, it was voted to purchase the Rodgers Organ from the Stevens Point Baptist Church. So, I said, "Let's take pledges to see if we have enough money to purchase this organ for \$5,000." The pledges were tallied and the total pledges came to \$5,000! And that price included 6 speakers, each normally at a price of \$1,000 each, if purchased separately. I was later informed that the replacement cost for an organ of this quality would be \$42,000. But that's not the end of the story!

The day came when the Rodgers Organ Company from Waupaca, WI, came to the Baptist Church to remove the organ so it could be relocated at the Almond Church. They had the organ turned on and did various other things to accomplish the move. Then they decided to briefly walk out of the

church. One man was out of the sanctuary, and the other was almost out. I sat near the front and stared at the organ. Then, smoke began to rise!! I quickly yelled for help and pulled the electric cord from the power source. The men quickly began taking the organ apart to find the problem as the smoke continued to rise. The smoke eventually settled down and they called their expert repairman. He opened things up further and revealed black soot in a metal enclosure caused by 2 overheated capacitors. This can happen when an organ is not played regularly. (Amazing!) So, the repairman replaced all 6 capacitors for good measure. The Rodgers Organ men knew this could happen when an organ hasn't been played for awhile (like a year and a half since I last played it). They called it the "burn out period." They more or less expected it! I was really surprised and grateful when the Baptist Church paid the repair bill because it happened in their church and could have burned their church down!
